Crime Unit

Supervisor: Detective Sergeant Byron SCHWASS

The Grey Bruce County Crime Unit (six Detectives) led, assisted or managed 78 Benchmark Occurrences from August 1st, to October 1st, 2021.

This includes 11 Sudden Death investigations (two of which were opiate overdoses), 13 sexual assaults, 19 Criminal Harassment investigations, two in depth Missing Person cases (both resolved with the person found alive), and one Indecent Act, as well as assisting other Major Crime Units with investigations/statements, and providing guidance to uniform personnel on criminal investigations.

The Grey Bruce Major Crime Unit continues to follow up leads, prepare for court, and investigate several ongoing Homicides which fall under the direction of OPP Criminal Investigations Branch (CIB). SPRUNG Homicide (Meaford) completed the preliminary inquiry for 1st degree Murder, SOLOMON Homicide (Saugeen First Nation) court pending, JACKSON attempt murder (North Bruce Peninsula), and the CHISAR homicide (male arrested for 2nd degree Murder). *D/Sgt and 2 DCs currently partnered with Hamilton Police Service on this. (Found Human Remains, Southgate).

- The Nolan PANCHYSHYN homicide has resulted in a Plea to Manslaughter (04 Oct 2021)

All National and Ontario Sex Offenders, Hate Crime / Extremism Investigations and High Risk to re-offend Offenders and High Risk Domestic Violence Offenders continue to be managed by the Grey Bruce County Crime Unit.



Community Street Crime Unit

September welcomed D/S Blair back to the team from his temporary assignment at West Region while Acting DS Dudley returned to his role in Intelligence. The team had a great opportunity to learn from A/DS Dudley since May, as he brought new investigative ideas and resources along with years of experience in Drug Enforcement.

The CSCU focused heavily during the summer on establishing the legality of cannabis grows in Grey County over the summer. The investigation continued into September when the investigator learned that, as a result of a previous search warrant execution at a nearby grow, a Municipality of Meaford grow op was dismantled just days after the other search warrant. The property was then listed for sale and the investigation into the over production was concluded.

While drug investigations in other Municipalities had not culminated in September, later in the month, the unit executed a drug warrant in the Town of Meaford. This location was a frequently attended area by local drug users which prompted community complaints. A drug overdose occurred at the address just a few days prior to the warrant. The execution was conducted by Grey Bruce CSCU with the help of the Huron Perth CSCU as well as the ERT team. Police seized a large quantity of Methamphetamine along with cash and drug paraphernalia. Two persons were arrested and charged as a result.

There were two vehicle thefts in September, one in Southgate and another in Chatsworth. The Grey Bruce CSCU have developed a person of interest and will be working with other CSCU units in an attempt to locate the individual. The Grey Bruce CSCU continues to work with other jurisdictions, and as such, had supported South Bruce in an execution of a search warrant which resulted in the arrest of three individuals, two of whom has been wanted by various Counties and the seizure of a quantity of drugs.

Lastly, the team welcomed Detective Constable Katie WHITE to join as its newest member. Katie WHITE has been with the Grey Bruce OPP for over 5 years and has excelled as a front line officer. She will be a great asset to the team. She is a local of Grey/Bruce and brings with her well established community relationships and knowledge.

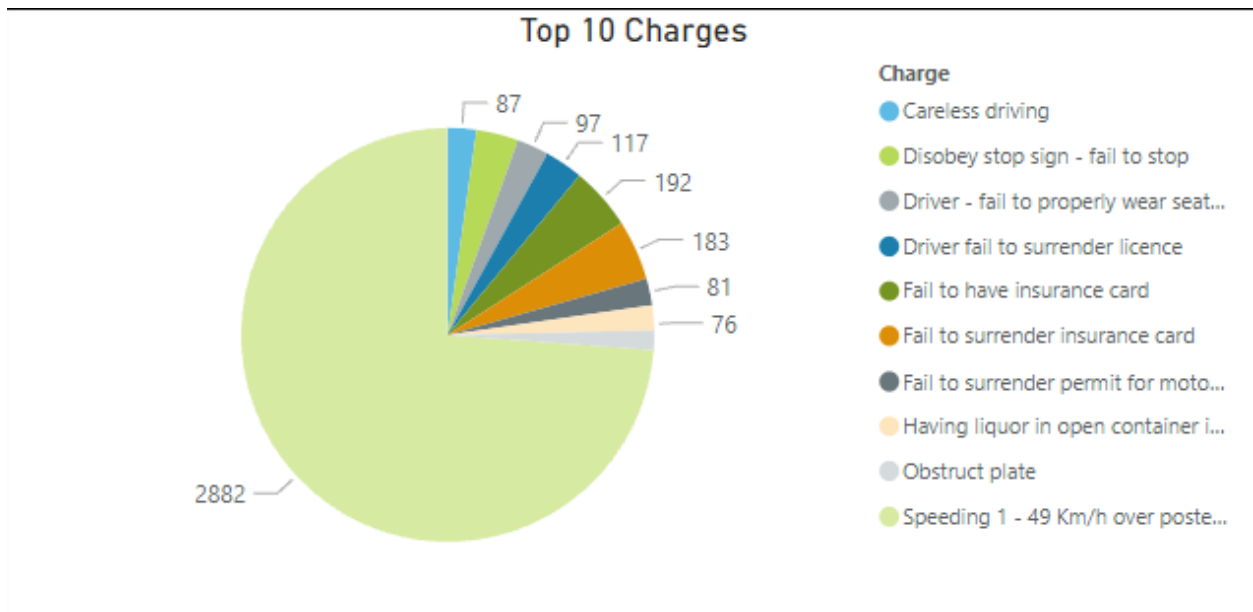

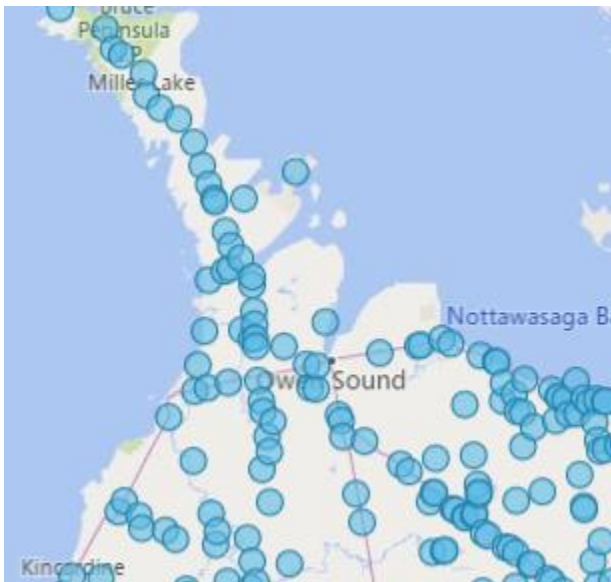

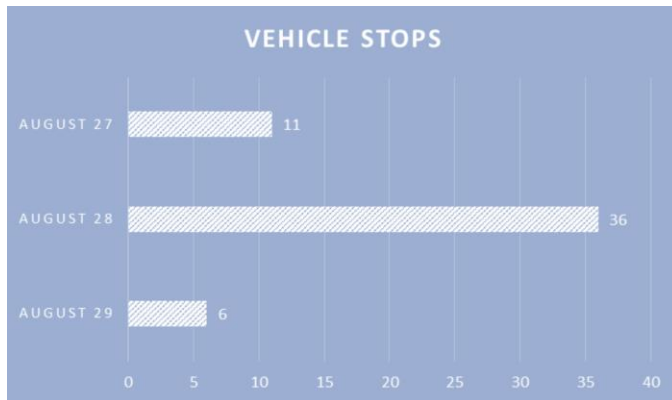
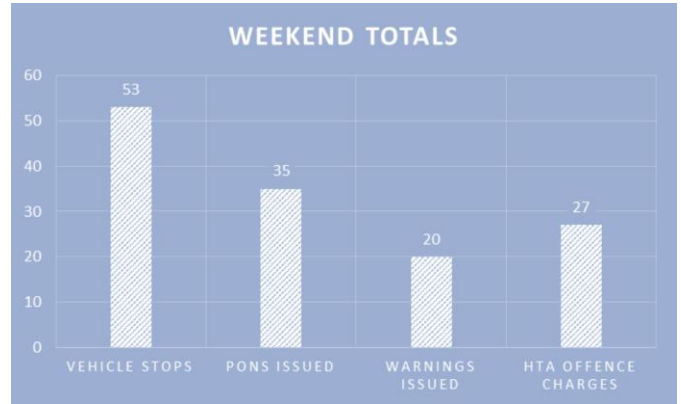


Traffic Violations in Grey Bruce

Mobile Mental Health & Addiction Response Team (MMHART)

The Mobile Mental Health Urgent Response Team provides mobile crisis support throughout Grey Bruce 24 hours a day and 7 days a week. The team works in collaboration with first responders to provide telephone or on site crisis interventions. The mandate of the team is to reduce unnecessary emergency room visits or re-visits by providing immediate support in the community. The Mobile Mental Health Urgent Response Team provides follow up with individuals for a period of up to 30 days (CMHA, 2021).
